## **UBH LAB INSPECTORS PROVE EXCELLENCE IN THE DETAILS**

April 27, 2018: The laboratory staff at Uintah Basin Healthcare recently participated in an inspection for the College of American Pathologists (CAP) at RCHP Health System in Sierra Vista, Arizona.

CAP is a member-based physician organization founded in 1946 comprising approximately 18,000 board-certified pathologists. It serves patients, pathologists, and the public by fostering and advocating best practices in pathology and laboratory medicine. It is the world's largest association composed exclusively of pathologists certified by the American Board of Pathology, and is widely considered the leader in laboratory quality assurance. The CAP is an advocate for high-quality and cost-effective medical care. The CAP does accreditation of laboratories under deemed authority by The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The CAP's peer-based inspector model provides a unique balance of regulatory and educational coaching supported by the most respected worldwide pathology organization. It uses teams of participating professionals who are qualified by completing an inspector training program provided by the CAP.



On-site inspections occur every two years. These inspections utilize CAP Accreditation checklists which assess upwards of **3000 standards** that must be met in order to successfully qualify for accreditation. UBMC provides an inspection team at least once each two-year cycle to inspect other laboratories seeking CAP accreditation, most recently the VA Hospital in Grand Junction, Colorado, St. Mary's Hospital in Grand Junction, Colorado and RCHP Health System in Sierra Vista, Arizona.
